Pilot Program Proposal

Roll Out Strategy

- Roll out to 100-125 neighboring homes
 - Ward 1 (Monday)
 - Ward 3 (Wednesday)
- GlassBandit will provide each residence with an 18 Gallon Yellow Bin and communication on the service
- Additional Communication (initial rollout) to be provided by the City

Program

- \$2 per home per month billed to Prairie Village
- Pickup runs every other trash day
- Customer service managed by GlassBandit
- Recommended to run for 6 months
- GlassBandit to provide monthly updates including usage data and route feedback



Beyond the Pilot

What would full partnership look like between GlassBandit and Prairie Village?

- Repeat Pilot Program Logistics (18-gallon bin provided, pickup every other trash day, \$2 per home per month cost)
- GlassBandit provides services for 4 events per calendar year (glass pickup, guest speaker at school, etc.)
- GlassBandit provides email reminders for opted in residents
- GlassBandit manages customer support
- Residents get free listing in Yellow Bin Pages (local business directory for GB customers)

Compost Collective KC: Process



PV resident fills bucket with food scraps (even meat + dairy + paper towels + pizza boxes!)



We swing by and:

- 1. Collect the scraps
- 2. Clean the bucket and lid
- 3. Replace the compostable liner



We haul the scraps to a farm or MO Organic to be turned into nutrient-dense soil



~90 billion pounds of food is wasted in the US per year – that's 123x the weight of the Empire State building



OR

Enough food to fill the Rose Bowl in Pasadena – EVERY DAY

That's 365 Rose Bowls per year



Food waste results in 8% of global greenhouse gas emissions 6x greater than the aviation sector



That's bad because:

Food waste in landfills emits methane which is 28x more harmful than CO2 from compost



Of the top 100 most impactful carbon drawdown solutions,

Food waste reduction is #3

Compost is #60



What can Prairie Village do about it?

43% of that wasted food comes from households



What can Prairie Village do about it?

Based on average usage, PV has potential to divert


2.2 million pounds per year
