Prairie Village Homes Association Begins Tree Fertilization Program

This Spring, the Prairie Village Homes Association began a tree fertilization program to help improve the health of street trees. Over the years, the weather can take its toll on trees. Sometimes the trees need a "boost" to maintain their health.

Working with Shawnee Mission Tree Service, the association fertilized 303 street trees this year through a root zone injection process which involves making between 75 and 100 injections of fertilizer into the ground surrounding the tree trunk. Each tree receives 30 – 40 gallons of fertilizer. The area covered was from Mission Road to Granada Lane between 67th and 69th Streets.

into trash set out for collection. To help keep Prairie Village neighborhoods looking clean, keep these tips in mind when setting your garbage out for collection.

- Set your trash out no earlier than the night before collection.
- Place your trash in barrels or cans rather than bags
- Cover trash barrels and cans with tight-fitting lids.
- If you recycle newspapers, put them at the bottom of your recycling bin. This will help keep papers from blowing out of your bin, and into the street or a neighbor's yard.

No Solicitors

It's 6:00 p.m. and your family has just taken their seats for dinner when the doorbell rings. You answer the door and a young solicitor tells you he is your neighbor and is raising money to send himself to Paris for the Summer. The solicitor tells you he has to sell a certain number of magazine subscriptions in order to get to his destination. You tell him "No thanks." and close the door. In the meantime. your food is cold and you wonder why you have a "No Solicitors" sticker on your front door if people will not pay attention to it.

This scenario has played out at many residences all over the City. Every year, officers respond to calls on annoying or overbearing solicitors. Sometimes these calls result in the arrest of a solicitor who has not followed the guidelines set forth by City Ordinances.

The following is a list of some of the guidelines solicitors must follow:

Solicitors must obtain a permit! Individuals must obtain a solicitation permit from the City prior to soliciting. This does not apply to charitable organizations such as the Girl Scouts of America, etc.

"No Solicitors," means no solicitors! A solicitor should not knock on the door or ring the doorbell for the purpose of selling a service or product for profit, if it is posted "No Solicitors."

Solicitors must follow time guidelines! Solicitors may not solicit prior to 10:00 a.m. or after 8:00 p.m. and between 5:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on any day.

Solicitors must leave when asked by the homeowner or apartment dweller!

Solicitors must tell you the truth! Solicitors cannot make any statements which misrepresent the purpose of their call, or use any plan or scheme which misrepresents their purpose.

By becoming familiar with the City ordinance on solicitation, residents can contact the Police Department when solicitors do not follow the rules. For a copy of the City's Door to Door Solicitation ordinance contact the Crime Prevention Unit at 913-385-4613.
