

## Your Tax Dollars at Work

Prairie Village property owners will soon be receiving the annual Real Estate Tax Summary from the Johnson County Appraiser's Office, notifying them of the property taxes they will owe next year. These amounts are based on the 2004 appraised property values. Examining this document closely will help you gain a better understanding of how your property tax dollars are being spent.

last year the City received approximately 16% of your total tax bill. For the owner of a \$150,000 home, that was about \$272. This goes toward providing City services like 24-hourpolice protection, maintaining the City's infrastructure, parks, and much more.

One of the things you will notice is that several taxing entities, including the City of Prairie Village, are represented on the Tax Summary. Each taxing entity sets its own tax rate. The Johnson County Clerk's Office consolidates these rates into a single tax bill.

Further examination of the Real Estate Tax Summary will show you where your tax dollars go, including the portion received by Prairie Village. For example, tremendous value for their tax dollars. Your City Council and City staff remain committed to making sure your tax dollars are spent wisely.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

In the August primary elections, only 31% of registered Johnson County voters cast ballots. While this is a slight increase from the 2002 primaries, it still seems too low for our community.

One of the hallmarks of American democracy is the right to elect our political representatives and voice our opinions on community issues. This makes voting one of our most important civic duties. On November 2nd, we will once again have the opportunity to exercise our right to select candidates for national, state, and local offices, as well as a bi-state sales tax question. Make sure your voice is heard in November by voting.

But before you vote, you must register. It's also important to learn about the candidates and issues which will appear on the ballot. Registering to vote is easy. Voter registration forms are available at the Municipal Offices and on the Internet at <a href="https://www.jocoelection.org">www.jocoelection.org</a>. To vote on November 2nd, you must be registered by October 18th.

Becoming an informed voter takes some work, but is definitely worth the effort. Read local newspapers about the candidates and issues; attend candidate forums; and when possible, try to meet the candidates and listen to what they have to say about issues that are important to you.

When it comes time to vote, Johnson County voters have several options, including advance voting, voting by mail, and, of course, voting at the polls on November 2nd. # Halloween Safety Tips for Parents and Kids

Halloween safety tips for all the little ghosts and goblins are this month's crime prevention topic. Below are some safety concerns to keep in mind this Halloween season.

- Be sure children wear clothing that is reflective, comfortable, and flame retardant.
- Check the costume's mask and make sure it does not obscure the child's vision.
- Accompany children who are too young to trick or treat by themselves.
- Suggest older kids go "trick or treating" in groups for safety reasons.

- Tell your kids never to enter a stranger's house for any reason.
- Suggest carrying a flashlight for additional visibility.
- Inspect all the candy your child collects and do not eat candy that is not in its original wrapper.

# Attention Landlords and Tenants



The City of Prairie Village requires all owners of residential rental properties to obtain a rental property license. The licensing year is November 1st through October 31st. Owners of currently licensed rental properties should have already received license renewal materials in the mail. These must be completed and returned to the City Clerk's office by October 24th. A penalty of \$10 per month will be assessed beginning in November.

# Taking Care of Falling Leaves



When Fall arrives, leaf raking season begins. The City once again reminds you to properly dispose of your leaves. Here are several options:

#### DO:

- Mulch If the leaves in your yard aren't too deep, you can simply mow over them with a mulching mower, returning the clippings to your lawn.
- Compost Leaves are an important ingredient in any compost pile. For information about the City's composting regulations, contact Marcia Gradinger at 913-385-4605 or send an email to mgradinger@pvkansas.com.
- Rake and Bag When you rake leaves, bag them and place them at the curb for collection on the same day as your regular household trash and recycling. You may use either paper or plastic bags.

#### DON'T:

- Don't rake leaves into the street this can clog up the storm drains and may create a traffic hazard.
- Don't rake leaves into creeks or drainage channels this can cause drainage problems. Besides, it's against the law.

Leaves are beautiful...when they're on the trees. Once they fall to the ground, they should be disposed of properly.


In October, Jean Cook and Donna Yeager will share the walls of the Municipal Offices R.G. Endres Gallery.
