
Warman Receives Recognition

June Emergency Preparedness

On an average, the Johnson County area is affected by 40-60 thunderstorms per year. Lightning is one of the most common and dangerous elements of a thunderstorm. More deaths are attributed to lightning each year than tornadoes and hurricanes combined. Some common myths about lightning that should be discredited are:

- ✓ If it is not raining, there is no danger from lightning.
- The rubber soles of shoes and tires on a car will protect you from a lightning strike.
- People struck by lightning carry an electrical charge and should not be touched.



In reality, these are the facts:

- Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as ten miles away from any rainfall.
- Rubber-soled shoes and rubber tires provide NO protection from lightning. However, a steel frame of a hard topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal.
- Lightning-strike victims carry no electrical charge and should be assessed and treated immediately for injuries or need for resuscitation.
