Earth Fair 6 will be held Saturday, April 8th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Shawnee Mission East High School, 75th Street and Mission Road. Admission is free.

The fair will feature cars of the future including all the hybrids and a solar race car from Kansas State University. Chairperson Margaret Thomas said more than 60 organizations will participate with displays, live performances by school groups, Kansas City's own "Green Elvis," craft activities for kids, live animals to touch, eco-products and live plants for sale, an art show, and presentations on how to build a rain garden at your home, garden for butterflies, and make the most of the OWLS (Outdoor Wildlife Learning Sites) at Prairie Village schools.



Participating in the public comment session of City Council meetings — City Council meetings are held on the first and third Monday of each month at 7:30 pm in the City Council Chambers. Time is set aside at the beginning of each meeting for public input.

Annual Large Item Pick-Up April 22nd

Make large item pick-up part of your spring cleaning.

The City's annual large item pick-up will be on Saturday, April 22nd. All items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. for collection.

CFC CONTAINERS

There will be a separate collection on Saturday, April 22nd for CFC containers including refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, icemakers, and de-humidifiers. Call Deffenbaugh Disposal Service at 913-631-3300 for more information.

LARGE ITEM PICK-UP RULES

- All items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. for collection.
- Large item pick-up is for residential properties only, not for apartments or commercial areas.

- Any large pieces of glass need to be broken down and placed in boxes.
- Swing sets must be disassembled.
- No items larger than a household-size refrigerator will be collected.

ITEMS NOT COLLECTED INCLUDE

- Tree limbs or tree stumps (only limbs/branches cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled will be collected).
- Hazardous materials (tires, toxic materials, paint cans, car batteries, fireplace ashes, solvents, or oils).
- Excessive quantities of concrete, rubble, or refuse from remodeling, construction, or demolition of buildings.

Park Shelters - \$5 per hour for residents (maximum 6 hrs per reservation) or \$10 per hour for non-residents (maximum 6 hrs per reservation)

- \$5 per hour for residents or \$10 per hour for non-residents

Ball Fields in City Parks - \$1 per hour (maximum 3 hrs. per week)

Parents and Kids; Know the Rules for Personal Safety

Today's world has changed so much since I was a child growing up in Prairie Village. Now that I'm an adult and raising my own two kids, I realize why my parents were always asking me where I was going.

Below are some basic safety rules parents, and most importantly kids, should be aware of as they traverse in such a busy community.

- Always check first with your parents or with the person in charge before you go anywhere.
- Use the "Buddy System" and try not to go anywhere alone even when you're playing.
- Know your full name, address and phone number and your parents' full name too!
- Say "No" to anyone who tries to touch you or treat you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable or scared.
- Tell your parents if you feel scared, confused or uncomfortable about any situation.
- Never hitchhike or try to get a ride with anyone you do not know and stay away from people who try to lure you to their car.
- If you get separated from your parents in a public place, immediately go to a store employee or checkout counter and inform the person you are lost and need help locating your parents.

Remember, these are rules to live by. Think safety and security as you move about in this hustle and bustle world.
