Mayor's Message

As many of you know, the City Council recently adopted the **Village Vision Strategic Investment Plan** after nearly two years of planning, study, and citizen input. This plan contains 48 recommendations for actions the City can take to improve our city and ensure Prairie Village's continued place as a premier community in the metropolitan area.

I recently appointed task forces to conduct further study of two critical areas of the Village Vision Plan: the 75th Street corridor and home construction and renovation issues.

The 75th Street Task Force, led by Ward IV Councilman Pat Daniels, is investigating strategies for improving the 75th Street Corridor from State Line to the City's western boundary. A consistent theme throughout the Village Vision community meetings was a desire to improve the appearance and value of the corridor, as well as the properties along 75th Street. The task force will be working with City staff and planning consultants to identify options and alternatives for the corridor. Of course, as the task force's mission and plans come into focus, residents will have an opportunity to provide comments and suggestions.

The second task force, led by Ward IV councilwoman Laura Wassmer, will be exploring ways to preserve the charm and character of the City's neighborhoods. During the Village Vision planning process, residents also expressed a desire to encourage reinvestment in the City's housing stock, but in a manner which would maintain the neighborhood character which has come to define Prairie Village. The task force will be exploring a variety of issues, including developing a design style guide to assist residents with home renovation projects.

Stay tuned to future issues of the *Prairie Village Voice* for updates on progress being made by these two task forces.

Prairie Village Fire Safety Statistics

- The two primary causes of fires are electrical problems and improper disposal of smoking materials.
- Average emergency response time is less than five minutes.
- All police, fire and ambulance vehicles have defibrillators, which are coming down in cost to less than \$2,000 each and are recommended in businesses, when possible.
- All local emergency personnel are receiving the new American Heart Association CPR training, which is changing to emphasize a higher chest compression to breath ratio. Go to www.americanheart.org to see the latest recommendations for CPR.

Attention Landlords and Tenants

The City of Prairie Village requires all owners of residential properties to obtain a rental property license. The licensing year is November 1st through October 31st. Owners of currently licensed properties will be receiving license renewal materials in the mail. These must be completed and returned by October 24th. A penalty of \$10 per month will be assessed beginning in November.

Taking Care of Fall Leaves

When Fall arrives, leaf raking season begins. The City once again reminds you to properly dispose of your leaves. Here are several options:

DO:

- Mulch If the leaves in your yard aren't too deep, you can simply mow over them with a mulching mower, returning the clippings to your lawn.
- Compost Leaves are an important ingredient in any compost pile. For information about the City's composting regulations, contact Marcia Gradinger at 913-385-4605 or email to mgradinger@pvkansas.com.
- Rake and Bag When you rake leaves, bag them and place them at the curb for collection on the same day as your regular household trash and recycling. Use paper bags for your leaves. Paper bags can be recycled too.

DON'T:

- Don't rake leaves into the street this can clog up the storm drains and may create a traffic hazard.
- Don't rake leaves into creeks or drainage channels this can cause drainage problems. Besides, it's against the law.

Leaves are beautiful...when they're on trees. Once they fall to the ground, they should be disposed of properly.



Community Center Reservation Fee Changes

On September 17th, the City Council approved new fees for the Community Center effective October 1, 2007. The new fee for all reservations is \$10/hour during the week and \$15/hour on the weekend. The City Council also approved a \$50 fee for Alcohol Permits effective immediately. Reservations for 2008 can be made starting on October 1, 2007 in the City Clerk's office.

Auto Theft and Auto Burglary Alert

You can't have my car or any belongings in it. These are thoughts I sometimes have when I see an increase in the amount of auto theft and auto burglary reports. It can be so easy to leave valuables and other important items lying around in plain view inside your vehicle in such a hustle and bustle fast paced society that we live.

But what typically happens is people become forgetful and do not remember if they locked their vehicle, left their keys in the ignition, or left valuables in plain view for the bad guy to see and steal.

In this month's crime prevention article, the Crime Prevention Unit lists some safety and security tips to help you keep your car in your possession as well as preventive measures you can take to deter auto theft and auto burglary.

- Never leave your keys in your car when it is unattended even when it is parked inside your enclosed garage.
- With the upcoming cooler season, warming up your car while it is unlocked is not only unsafe it is against the city ordinance.
- Do not store valuables inside your car where they are in plain view.
- Auto burglars are opportunists who do seek out cars to steal and break into.
- Use your car alarm if applicable.
- Try to avoid parking your vehicle in locations where the chance of it being broken into may increase.
- If you park your car outside at night, try to park underneath a street light or in a well lit area.
- Properly illuminate your home's driveway or garage entry.

By following some simple and easy automobile security tips you can try to keep the auto thief and auto burglar outside your car and you in the driver's seat. Remember, do not hesitate dialing 911 when you observe suspicious activity.
