- Large item pick-up is for residential properties only, not for apartments or commercial areas.
- Any large pieces of glass need to be broken down and placed in boxes.
- Swing sets must be disassembled.
- No items larger than a household-size refrigerator will be collected.

ITEMS NOT COLLECTED INCLUDE

- Tree limbs or tree stumps (only limbs/branches cut into 4 foot lengths and bundled will be collected).
- Hazardous materials (tires, toxic materials, paint cans, car batteries, fireplace ashes, solvents, or oils).
- Excessive quantities of concrete, rubble, or refuse from remodeling, construction, or demolition of buildings.


Part-Time Animal Enumerators Needed

Take care of your Pets

During the winter remember to take care of your pets. Following are some guidelines from the United States Humane Society for protecting your pets from the winter cold.

- Pets who spend a lot of time outdoors need more food in the winter because keeping warm depletes energy. Routinely check your pet's water dish to make certain the water is fresh and unfrozen. Use plastic food and water bowls rather than metal; when the temperature is low, your pet's tongue can stick and freeze to metal.
- Warm engines in parked cars attract cats and small wildlife, who may crawl up under the hood. To avoid injuring any hidden animals, bang your car's hood to scare them away before starting your engine.
- No matter what the temperature, wind chill can threaten a pet's life. A dog or cat is happiest and healthiest when kept indoors. If your dog is an outdoor dog, however, he/she must be protected by



- The salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate the pads of your pet's feet. Wipe the feet with a damp towel before your pet licks them and irritates his/her mouth.
- Don't leave dogs outdoors when the temperature drops. Most dogs, and all cats are safer indoors, except when taken out for exercise.

Also remember to license your pets. Renew before March 1 to avoid a penalty. Neutered/spayed animals are \$6 and Non-neutered/spayed animals are \$12. Download a license application at www.pvkansas.com.

Look Before You Build
