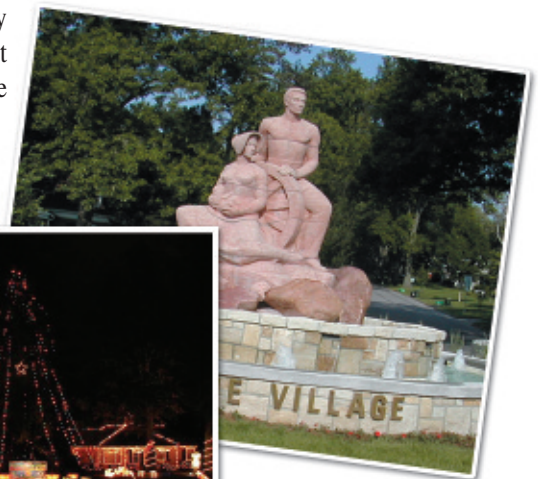
## PRAIRIE VILLAGE PHOTO CONTEST

# MAYOR'S MESSAGE



I am excited to announce that 2010 will be a very busy year. The City will embark on several major projects in 2010 which will provide many beneficial improvements to our community.

The City Council has approved \$9 million in bond proceeds to implement a major street and storm sewer renovation program. Taking advantage of low interest rates and low construction costs, the City will be able to make improvements that would normally take 5 years. It is anticipated that the City will save approximately \$1.5 million in construction costs by consolidating the projects. A more detailed article about the improvements can be found on page 8.

In 2009, the City Council also approved a Parks and Recreation Master Plan which outlined possible improvements to your parks system. The City will begin implementing these improvements in 2010. At the recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Committee, the City will make improvements to Franklin Park including the construction of a new shelter house, restroom facility, and improvement to existing play areas. The City will be hosting a public forum on proposed improvements on January 13th (see page 3 for more details). In addition, the City will begin exploring the possibility of combining the two parts of Weltner Park by realigning Cambridge Street. This consolidation of the park areas will allow for better use of this park and traffic flow.

The City will also be making changes to its trash, recycling and composting services. The City was proud to announce, in cooperation with Lane-4 and Ripple Glass Recycling, the installation of a glass recycling drop off facility at the Corinth Shopping Center behind the Hen House. In addition, based on concerns that the Johnson County Landfill could reach its capacity by 2027, the City has decided to implement a pay-as-you throw system and limit the ability to combine compostable materials with solid waste. A more detailed article about the changes can be found on pages 6-7.

Finally, the City will begin the search for a new Public Works Director. Bob Pryzby announced his retirement in December. Bob has provided outstanding service to the community for over 15 years and we will miss him dearly. The City wishes Bob all the best as he begins a new stage of his life.

So as the New Year progresses, you will see many enhancements and changes to our wonderful community.

The State Treasurer’s Office handles all unclaimed property such as a refund check that the recipient never receives. Last year alone the State Treasurer’s Office took in over \$21 million in unclaimed property and \$11 million was returned to the rightful owners. There are no fees or costs levied by the State of Kansas for this service nor are there any fees to claim property. Kansans do not have to pay anything to claim what is rightfully theirs.

## Ball Field Reservation Applications Due

Baseball season will be here before you know it, and ball fields in Prairie Village are always in demand. Make plans now to reserve a practice field for your team.

The City of Prairie Village allows reservations of ball fields for soccer, baseball, and softball practices. Prairie Village teams (those with a majority of players who are Prairie Village residents or attend school in Prairie Village) will be given priority for field reservations, but any team may apply to reserve a field. Teams can reserve two

practice times per week for up to 1 1/2 hours. Fields are available in Porter, Franklin, Windsor and Meadowlake Parks. The Baseball Field at Franklin Park will not be available due to park enhancements.

If your team reserved a field during 2009, your coach should receive a 2010 application form soon. You may also obtain one at the Municipal Offices or online at [www.pvkansas.com/parks](http://www.pvkansas.com/parks). There is a \$75 reservation fee per team that must be submitted with your application.

## Holiday Tree Recycling Program



The City will once again sponsor a Holiday Tree Recycling Program for Prairie Village residents. Trees may be placed in the designated areas of Porter, Franklin, and Meadowlake Parks, and in the Harmon Park parking lot near the water tower. Trees must be free of all lights, ornaments, stands and any metal nails, etc. as these items will damage the chipping machine. Residents may take the chips for their own use. The program will be available from December 26, 2009 to January 17, 2010.

# WASTE MANAGEMENT CHANGES

As we approach the New Year, the City of Prairie Village wanted to update you on the upcoming changes to the solid waste, recycling and composting regulations under the City's program. Please note that if your homes association currently provides trash services you should check with your association to see if any changes have been proposed to your service.

The Johnson County Landfill is the current location for all solid waste material collected under the City's contract with Deffenbaugh Industries. In December of 2007, Johnson County adopted a new County Solid Waste Management Plan which is one of the principal driving forces behind the changes to the City's program.

Our new contract with Deffenbaugh Industries, Inc. is the result of long negotiations, thorough assessment of our solid waste, recycling, and composting needs, and pending changes in our regions regulations. The City understands several of the changes will require

The Johnson County Solid Waste Management Plan states that to keep the Johnson County Landfill viable until its closure in 2027:

- The region must increase curbside recycling
- The region must eliminate disposal of yard waste in the landfill by 2011
- The region must work towards implementing a countywide volume-based waste collection rate structure

adjustments to your current practices. **THE CHANGES WILL BEGIN ON MAY 3, 2010.**

Prior to the implementation of the changes to the program, the City will host several informational sessions during which you will be able to ask questions; see the types of containers, first hand, prior to picking the size of your solid waste container; and pick up free yard waste bags.

The City along with Deffenbaugh Industries will be sending a special addition of the *Prairie Village Voice* in March of 2010 to provide you with additional information. You will also receive postcards reminding you of key dates during the process. In addition, the City's website [www.pvkansas.com](http://www.pvkansas.com)

will provide more information on the changes.

## Changes to Regular Trash Collection (Solid Waste)

- Each household will be provided with one 65 gallon or 35 gallon trash cart. You will be able to choose the appropriate size for your needs.
- The trash carts will be delivered in April of 2010. These green containers with black lids can be wheeled to the curb on your collection day and stored in your garage or behind the front building line of your home.
- Solid waste (regular trash) will be limited to what fits in the trash cart. Any excess can be set out in standard trash bags but will require an overflow waste sticker at a cost of \$1.25 per bag. Items must fit in a standard trash bag. Overflow waste stickers will be available at several locations.



# WASTE MANAGEMENT CHANGES

## Changes to Recycling Collection



- Each household will be provided with one 65 gallon recycling cart
- The recycling carts will be delivered in April of 2010. These green containers with yellow lids can be wheeled to the curb on your collection day and stored in your garage or behind the front building line of your home.
- Recycling will continue to be unlimited. You may place your excess in your old recycling bin, or any other container labeled with the word “recycling” or the universal symbol for recycling.
- The list of recyclable material will not be changing.

## Changes to Yard Waste Collection (Compostable Material)

- Yard waste must be placed in a biodegradable paper bag or a 35 gallon or less rigid container. Standard bundles of 4 feet in length and less than 18 inches in circumference are also allowed.
- Yard waste will not be allowed in the regular trash container or in plastic bags.
- You will be allowed 8 items (any combination of bags, containers, or bundles) during the months of January, February, May, June, July, and December.
- You will be allowed 12 items during the months of March, April, August, September, October and November.
- Any excess can be set out in approved containers, bags, or bundles but will require an overflow waste sticker at a cost of \$1.25 per item. Overflow waste stickers will be made available at several locations.



## Changes to Bulky Item Pickup



- The City will still hold a City-wide annual Bulky Item Pickup in April. In 2010 it is scheduled for Saturday, April 24th.
- You will also be allowed one bulky-item each month. Monthly bulky-items must be smaller items such as rugs, counter top appliances, or small furniture.
- The following items are excluded from bulky item pickup: construction materials, automotive parts, tires, batteries, hazardous waste, etc.
- If you have more than one bulky item you will still be able to schedule a bulky item pickup with Deffenbaugh for a separate fee.

# PUBLIC WORKS

## Busy Construction Season for Public Works in 2010



The next year and a half will be very busy for the Public Works Department. The City is currently embarking on a major street and sewer renovation program. The Public Works Department will be coordinating the construction of more than three times the number of street and storm sewer projects than normally constructed.

In December, the City issued just over \$9 million in bonds to finance the improvements. Taking advantage of low interest rates and low construction costs, the City will be able to make improvements that would normally take 5 years. It is anticipated that the City will save approximately \$1.5 million in construction costs by consolidating the projects. The overall renovation program includes street construction, replacing metal pipes with concrete pipes, and adding storm sewers to two streets that do not currently have a storm sewer system.

The street construction will include work on many streets throughout the City. The improvements range from complete street reconstructions that include all new pavement, curbs, sidewalks and driveway

approaches to smaller street projects which include mill and overlay with repair to the curbs, sidewalks and driveways.

The storm sewer work involves the replacement of old corrugated metal drainage pipes with new concrete pipes. Many of the existing metal pipes have outlasted their useful life and by replacing them the overall quality of the storm water drainage system will be improved. Two other storm sewer projects will add new storm sewers to streets that currently do not have them.

In addition to the work, the City will be conducting its normal maintenance projects which include the Concrete program, Drainage program, Slurry Seal program, Crack Seal program, Asphalt Repair program, and the Pavement Marking program. As you can see, there will be significant construction activity in 2010 in the City. # PUBLIC SAFETY

## Technology Upgrades in the Police Department

In 2009, the City Council approved two significant technology enhancements within the Police Department; Intergraph, which is our new records management and computer aided dispatch system and ICOP, our new in-car digital system. When Prairie Village transitioned to Intergraph, we joined a consortium that includes most cities in Johnson County. The system promotes better information sharing and collaboration between other law enforcement agencies. Providing mobile data terminals inside the patrol car keeps officers in the field where they can respond to calls for service more effectively. Report writing is streamlined as officers are able to send the reports via a secure internet connection to supervisors, and then

have the same report uploaded to the records management system, which eliminates dual entry by Records personnel. The ICOP in-car digital video system is the third system the Police Department has implemented since the mid 1990s. This system gives us the ability to store in-car video recordings on a server which improves our efficiency. In addition to better quality recordings, the system has other features that improve overall maintenance, and further help our mission of serving the public. The next time you have the opportunity, take a look at a squad car and see how we are making improvements to better serve the community.

## THE COMFORT OF COMPOST

You have three 50-year-old trees on your property, your street is lined with oak trees, and you've just learned that the Region is moving towards a pay as you throw system. So, what is the solution? Learn the comfort of compost!

Compost is a soil-like material that is formed when plant and other organic matter decompose through the beneficial action of insects, earthworms, bacteria and fungi. Making and using compost reduces both the quantity of materials going into landfills and the need to add man-made chemicals to gardens.

### Compost DO'S and DON'TS:

- DON'T create a fire hazard, nuisance or health hazard
- DO include yard waste
- DON'T include kitchen scraps, food items and garbage
- DO locate in the rear yard at least 15 feet from any building and at least 5 feet from the property line, in an area where water will not stand
- DON'T exceed 150 cubic feet in volume and 4 feet in height
- DO enclose on three sides
- DO keep moistened
- DO layer repeatedly 2-3 inches of sand or soil, 6-8 inches of yard waste, 1-2 inches of fertilizer or manure
- DON'T have more than one pile per acre of property
- DON'T compost: black walnut leaves or twigs, coal or charcoal ash, diseased or insect-ridden plants, pet wastes, yard trimmings treated with chemical pesticides or herbicides

### TIPS for a successful compost pile:

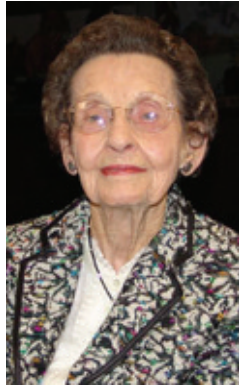
- Pick a shady spot
- Include a mix of "browns" (dead leaves, twigs) and "greens" (grass clippings) in your compost
- Chop or shred larger materials. Warning: whole oak leaves last forever
- Periodically turn materials to distribute air and moisture
