

SISTER CITY VISIT

The Prairie Village Sister City Committee welcomed a delegation of visitors from our sister city, Dolyna, Ukraine, during the first week of June. The visit was arranged through the Open World Program of the Library of Congress and hosted by the International Visitors Council of Greater Kansas City. The delegation consisted of five city representatives and a facilitator. Prairie Village residents hosted the visitors in their homes during their stay.

The visitors spent a day observing Prairie Village government operations and attended a city council meeting. Also on the agenda were visits to the Prairie Village Public Works, the Shawnee Mission School District, Johnson County Community Services, Board of Elections, and meetings with local state legislators. The group visited the State Capitol, the Kansas State Museum and Library, and KU's Center for Russian, Eastern European and Eurasian Studies.

Next year the Sister City Committee is planning a Ukrainian art exhibit. The director of the Dolyna museum is interested in collecting children's drawings from Prairie Village for display. One of the purposes of sister cities is to stimulate environments through which communities will creatively learn, work, and solve problems through reciprocal cultural, educational, municipal, business, professional and technical exchanges and projects and the Sister City

Committee hopes the Ukrainian art exhibit will help bring our two communities closer.
