

WHAT DOES STATE LAW ALLOW?

Generally, state law allows for petitions aimed at abandoning or adopting a form of government. However, just like petitions of any other type, these petitions must meet the structural requirements outlined by the state (form of petition, validity of signatures, etc).

WHAT'S NEXT?



The City is working with its legal counsel, as well as the legal and election professionals at the County, to determine if **these petitions meet the criteria necessary** to be placed on the ballot in November.

HOW DOES CITY COUNCIL FUNCTION?

The Prairie Village city council is currently made up of 12 members with two representatives from each of the city's six wards. They are elected to **four-year terms with elections staggered every two years.**

The mayor presides at all meetings of the council and has **general supervisory responsibilities** over the employees and business of the City.
