






Comprehensive Library Master Plan (CLMP)

- CLMP Study completed in 2015 and partially funded by Board of County Commissioners in 2016
- CLMP outlines specific and coordinated vision for Johnson County Library services, facilities, and staffing to inform the next 10-15 years
- Corinth Library Replacement is our next large-scale capital project, as prioritized by the Library Board






Corinth Library History

- Service began in Prairie Village in 1953 via a donated space in the Prairie Village Shopping Center
- The current Corinth Library opened its doors in February 1963 – it has been expanded twice since then
- Corinth houses roughly 107,000 items and is home to a well-loved kids area













































Community Center Campus Benefits



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Public Engagement

- 280 attendees, with 520 total questionnaire responses (in-person and online.)
- Initial support at the first public meeting showed 48% positive, 30% neutral, and 22% negative public sentiment about the project.
- After the second public meeting, 74% of people selected one of the three new Community Center options, and 26% of people selected option D.





















Library Funding

Library Funding

- Library is already funded through the CLMP we are not a part of any additional PV tax
- We are concurrently performing a test-fit study of our existing Corinth site
- Library staff are presenting to the Library Board regarding pros and cons of both site options





Community Center Cost

Community Center and Park Funding


- Project cost for the Community Center, including 10 acres of site development, new outdoor aquatic pool house, and the relocation of the tennis courts is \$55,341,099 projected in 2026.
- If the project moves forward, it would be funded by a 5/8 to 3/4 percent sales tax increase.
- Agreements with YMCA and Library continue to be negotiated.


Gymnasium

One 6,600 square foot multipurpose court (94' x 50' high school basketball court,) striped for basketball, volleyball, and pickleball.



















Indoor Aquatics



Adjacent to public plaza and main entry 2000 square feet, 133 occupants.











Next Steps

Community Center Next Steps

- If City Council approves of the general direction, they will put the project to a public vote.
- Anticipated mail in ballot to all PV residents in Spring 2025

Library Next Steps

- The Library Board will provide direction on whether it is desirable for the library to move to the PV campus –in advance of any public vote
- The Library Board and City of PV would need to agree in principle on property transfer terms prior to the Library Board's decision
- Library acquisition of property would be contingent on both approval from the BOCC and a successful public vote
