

ANNUAL LARGE ITEM PICK-UP

May 14th & May 21st

It's time to get rid of unwanted junk from your garage or basement during the City's annual Large Item Pick-up. The dates for large item pick-up have changed since they were originally published.

The new dates are:

- Saturday, May 14, 2011 for residents on 75th Street and north of 75th Street
- Saturday, May 21, 2011 for residents **south** of 75th Street.

Deffenbaugh changed the date due to a scheduling conflict.

Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. and no larger than a standard-size refrigerator. Deffenbaugh will pick up refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and ice makers. Please place these items a couple feet away from non-refrigerants.

Items collected include:

- Appliances
- Railroad ties (4' or less in length)
- Fencing (Cut into 4' x 4' sections. Bundle loose pickets for easy collection)
- Furniture



- Tree limbs cut to 4' feet or less in length and secured in bundles no more than 18" in diameter.
- Carpet (cut into 4' x 4' sections)
- Bundle or package loose items. Put out only those items not collected by regular trash service.



PUBLIC SAFETY

Spring Safety Tips

Springtime is upon us; not only bringing us some nicer weather, but also an increase in activity and pedestrian traffic. The following are some tips to keep in mind this spring to help keep you and your family safe.

- Inspect your children's toys and play sets to make sure bolts are tightened and nothing is broken.
- Slow down and watch for children playing in the street and on bikes when you are driving.
- Be vigilant about checking around your vehicle when backing out of your driveway. Children love to play around cars, and don't know to get out of the way.
- Remember to close your garage doors when not in use or when working outside.
- Remember to close and lock windows when you are not home.

- Lock exterior doors when you leave, no matter how long you will be gone.
- Don't forget to lock your car and park in a highly visible, lighted area. Remove valuables from your vehicle or hide them out of sight when you park.
- Record the serial numbers of your valuables. If they are stolen, this is the only way they could be identified and leads could be generated.
- Stay alert for any suspicious activity in your neighborhood. You are the first line of defense against criminal activity in Prairie Village.

Bicycle Safety

With warmer weather finally here, the number of bicyclists using the roads in Prairie Village is on the rise. For everyone's safety, it is important to remember that bicycle riders are not only granted the same RIGHTS as drivers of vehicles, but also are subject to all of the same RESPONSIBILITIES as drivers. Below are some tips for safe bicycle riding:

Traffic Signals:

- Individual riders can enter the intersection on yellow, but
- Trailing riders in a group may be cited if they enter on a red light.
- Riders may consolidate in a group at a red light in order to clear the intersection faster when it turns green.

Riding Single and Double File:

- Never ride more than double file except when passing.
- Merge to single file on two-lane streets when cars approach from behind.
- Ride single file on busy two-lane streets.
- Ride as far right as practical, whether in single or double file.

Passing:

- Complete the pass promptly.
- Do not impede trailing cars.
- Pass all the way to the next break in the group.



Regarding riding formations, Kansas Law specifies that riders may not travel more than two abreast. Although we understand peloton or pack riding is a common practice, it is neither safe nor practical for busy city streets. Riders must obey this and all traffic control ordinances in the same manner as any other motorist. By doing so, we can all help reduce the likelihood of collisions with motorists and pedestrians. I would encourage anyone who is a cyclist to visit www.ksdot.org and review all of the laws pertaining to cyclists on Kansas roadways.

The City has recently added a button to the traffic light pole on the northwest corner of 75th Street and Belinder for southbound bicyclists to use to "trip" the red light and turn it green. This was done to improve the safety for bicyclists since the sensors at this intersection have had difficulty detecting some types of bicycles. PUBLIC WORKS

Construction Updates



Construction season has begun and you may notice occasional road closures around the City. Three major projects are taking place during 2011 that may impede traffic. Following are details about each project. Visit www.pvkansas.com for more information.

SOMERSET DRIVE: ROE AVE TO REINHARDT LN

A joint project with Johnson County CARS program began in March. Construction will generally be completed in three phases: Roe Ave to 83rd St; 83rd St to Mission Rd; and Mission Rd to Reinhardt Ln. Somerset Drive will be narrowed from 4 to 5-lanes to 3 to 4-lanes from 83rd St to Reinhardt Ln. Curb and gutter will be replaced and the street will be resurfaced. Two small raised medians will be constructed in the center turn lane between 83rd St and Mission Rd to facilitate pedestrian crossing. The project will also include an eight foot wide trail from Roe Ave to Mission Rd.

NALL AVENUE: 63RD ST TO 67TH ST

A joint project with the City of Mission and the Johnson County CARS program began in February. Nall Ave will be reduced to a 3-lane street and an eight foot wide trail will be constructed on the west side of the street. Improvements also include replacement of curbs and pavement. This section of Nall Ave is closed to through traffic. The project is scheduled to be complete in fall 2011. For more information, visit www.mission-ks.org.

WELTNER PARK/CAMBRIDGE ST

Street improvements along Cambridge Street from State Line Rd to 79th Ter are planned. These roadway improvements will be done just prior to improvements to Weltner Park in 2011. Improvements are slated for summer/early fall. The project will include sidewalk, curb and new asphalt construction along with the realignment of Cambridge St. Visit www.pvkansas.com for more information.

Spring Clean Up

It's time for Spring clean up and preparation for the summer. The Codes Department requests your cooperation in maintaining your property to keep our neighborhoods safe and attractive. Following are some of the property maintenance requirements.

<u>Trash Containers:</u> New solid waste and recycle containers were issued a year ago. Containers must be stored behind the front building line and screened from view of the street. Violation Notices will be issued for non-compliance.

<u>Sidewalks:</u> Vegetation must be maintained so that is does not protrude into the sidewalk as an obstruction or hazard to pedestrians. Limbs should not be lower than 9 feet over the sidewalk. All litter, such as limbs, leaves, chewing gum, and weeds/grass, must be removed from sidewalk.

<u>Drainage</u>: Gutters and downspouts must be cleaned out for proper drainage and to prevent mosquito breeding. Check to make sure gutters are in good repair. Clean street curbing in front of your house of leaves, chewing gum and other litter that may flow into the drainage inlet.

<u>Leaf Debris:</u> Remove leftover leaf debris from your property. Yard waste will only be picked up in paper bags.

<u>Overgrown Vegetation:</u> Trim any overgrown vegetation around the fence line and house perimeter.

Grass and Weeds: Check your lawn mowers to ensure they are in good working condition. Grass must be cut and maintained at 8 inches or less. Any noxious weeds must be removed. If you notice a vacant house in your area that is not being mowed, please report it to the Codes Department.

<u>Painting:</u> Now is the time to check wall surfaces and window and door areas for chipped and peeling paint or wood rot. Paint and repair all needed areas.

Animal Sanitation: Regularly remove and properly dispose of animal waste in your yard.

VILLAGE GREEN

The City of Prairie Village will retrofit light fixtures in City Hall, provide new efficient controls for heating and cooling equipment, weatherize City buildings, and install a new geothermal heat pump system for City Hall, the Community Center, and the Police Department.

In March 2010, the City applied for two grants through the Kansas State Energy Office. These grants

were provided through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The first grant is the Public Projects Grant, which provides funding for energy conservation initiatives within public buildings. The second grant is the Renewable Energy Incentives Grant, which provides funding for geothermal renewable energy sources.

The Public Projects Grant provides the City with \$150,000 for energy savings measures and the Renewable Energy Incentives Grant provides the City with \$250,000 towards the installation of a new geothermal heat pump. The energy conservation initiatives will result in substantial cost savings once the projects

are complete. These projects are scheduled to begin following Village Fest and end near the start of the New Year. Please look for more information on the website in the coming months as we get closer to kicking off these projects.
