Recently, the Johnson County Landfill has announced it will no longer accept yard waste beginning in 2012. While this change will affect many of the surrounding communities, Prairie Village's service will remain the same because yard waste is currently composted under the city contract & ordinances.

Those residents under the city contract will still be able to set out 8 yard waste items per week during the months of January, February, May, June, July and December and 12 yard waste items per week during the months of March, April, August, September, October and November. Yard waste should be placed in a biodegradable paper bag or a 35 gallon or less rigid container.

In addition, many surrounding communities are moving to a pay-as-you-throw system where monthly fees will be based on volume of trash collected. The City of Prairie Village contracts with Deffenbaugh each year and assesses residents on

their property tax statement for annual trash fees. The current limits on trash and yard waste will still apply in 2012. No changes will occur to the current system.

In some areas, homes associations provide trash service (Corinth Downs, Countryside East, Paddock Court and Town & Country). If you live in one of these neighborhoods you should contact your homes association to see if any changes will be made to your service.

Don't forget that you can set out one small bulky item during the first full week of each month on your regular trash pickup day. For larger items, mark your calendar for the annual large item pick-up on May 12th for homes north of 75th Street and May 19th for homes south of 75th street. Greetings,

Now that the holidays are over, I would like to thank the residents of Prairie Village for their outstanding generosity. As of December 8, 2011, individuals, businesses and organizations have given over \$9,500 to the Mayor's Holiday Tree Fund and since that

As we begin the new year, I want to update you on the upcoming capital improvement projects and continued maintenance of the City's infrastructure. The annual drainage repair program, the annual paving program and the annual sidewalk/curb repair program will focus on existing infrastructure needing to be repaired or replaced.

In addition to the annual repair programs, a number of larger projects will be completed. The drainage culvert at Mission Road and 87th Street will be replaced. Three additional drainage pipes and four drainage structures will also be replaced on 81st Street south of Somerset Drive. Somerset Drive from Roe Avenue to Nall Avenue and Sagamore Road from 75th Street to 79th Street will be resurfaced and deteriorated curbs and sidewalks will be replaced.

How to Dispose of Your Holiday Tree

After the holidays, don't worry about how to dispose of your live Holiday tree! Residents can set out their Holiday trees on their regular trash days to be picked up by Deffenbaugh for composting. There's no need to cut up the tree, just place it next to any other composting/yard waste items.

A second option is the City sponsored Tree Recycling Program from December 19th through January 20th. Trees may be placed in designated areas of Porter, Franklin and Meadowlake Parks and in the Harmon Park parking lot near the water tower. Trees must be free of all lights, ornaments, stands and any metal nails, etc. as these items will damage the chipping machine. Residents may take the chips for their own use.

Reserve a Ball Field for your team

Baseball season will be here before you know it, and ball fields in Prairie Village are always in demand. Make plans now to reserve a practice field for your team. The City of Prairie Village allows reservations of ball fields for soccer, baseball, and softball practices. Prairie Village teams (those with a majority of players who are Prairie Village residents or attend school in Prairie Village) will be given priority for field reservations, but any team may apply to reserve a field. Teams can reserve two practice times per week for up to 1 1/2 hours. Fields are available in Porter, Franklin, Windsor and Meadowlake Parks. If your team reserved a field during 2011, your coach should receive a 2012 application form soon. Cold Weather Safety Tips

Here are some tips to help keep you safe during the cold weather.

- Do not leave your vehicle running and unattended. Not only is it an ordinance violation, it takes only a few seconds for a thief to steal an unlocked, running vehicle.
- Do not park on the street when a big snow is forecast to allow the street crews room to remove snow.
- Avoid taking large boxes out to the curb. Cut the boxes up and turn the labels inside out so no one knows what was in the box. Leaving a large flat screen TV, Wii, computer, or laptop box on the curb tells everyone who drives by what there is to steal in your home.

- Schedule a house watch online at www.pvkansas.com>>How Do I?.
 Cancel paper, mail and any other regular deliveries to the home.
- Set timers on lights, radios, or TVs to give the appearance some one is home and moving around the residence.
- Ask a trusted friend or neighbor to keep an eye on your home while you are away.
- Ask a neighbor to make tire tracks in the driveway when it snows to give the appearance someone is home.
- Do not post your travel plans on social networking sites like Facebook, MySpace, or Twitter. You want only people you trust knowing when your home will not be occupied.

Prairie Village continues to lead the glass recycling efforts with the Ripple Glass bin at Corinth. Lane4 Property Group hosts the Corinth and Prairie Village Glass bins and residents have delivered 583 tons of glass to these two locations in 2011 – that's 2.3 million bottles and jars!
