MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Greetings,

Upon the completion of the recent City Council elections, I want to take the opportunity to personally thank all of the Council Members for their service to the community. You might not be aware, but Prairie Village is unusual in that City Council members do not receive any payment for their service. This year we have

three council members who will be leaving the council after many years of service: Al Herrera, Ward 1, was first appointed to the Council in August of 1999 and was re-elected 3 times serving over 12 years; Dale Beckerman, Ward 4, has served on the Council since his election in April of 2008, serving four years; and Diana Ewy-Sharp, Ward 6, was first appointed in August of 1997 and was re-elected 3 times serving on the City Council for over 14 years. If you have a chance, please take the opportunity to thank them for their service to our community.

I also want to welcome recently elected and re-elected Council members; Ashley Weaver (Ward 1), Ruth Hopkins (Ward 2), Andrew Wang (Ward 3), Brooke Morehead (Ward 4), David Morrison (Ward 5), and Ted Odell (Ward 6). In the coming months, the Council will begin working on a number of items including the annual 2013 budget and the five year plan for infrastructure improvements (streets, sidewalks). I am pleased to announce the 2013 budget outlook is improved. The City finished 2012 with a higher than projected ending balance because of cost saving measures implemented by City staff and slightly higher than expected revenues in the areas of liquor and use taxes (taxes on goods purchased outside of Prairie Village, such as, internet sales).

We also have a number of events planned for this spring and summer including the BRGR LUV 4 Jazz 5k run (May 19th), dedication of new improvements at Weltner Park (May 12th), the Prairie Village Art Show (June 1st-3rd), Villagefest (July 4) and many other activities. PROJECT UPDATES

Benton House at Somerset

Somerset Elementary School has been demolished and work has begun on Benton House at Somerset, a Senior Living Facility. The Benton House Concept is a single-story, wood frame building comprised of apartment style suites that circle interior common areas and exterior courtyards. The first phase of the building will consist of 59 rooms. Phase 2 includes plans for a future building expansion.

Corinth Square Improvements

There will be a lot of activity at the Corinth Shopping Center this spring and summer with two additional projects getting underway. The first will be parking lot improvements. This will involve consolidation of the two driveway entrances along Mission Road into a single centered entrance, new lighting and landscaping. The second project will be facade improvements for the main building. The facade improvements will be completed by this fall. These two improvements are being funded with Community Improvement Funds. All of this construction will cause some inconvenience, so please continue to patronize the Corinth merchants. Once the construction is complete, Corinth Square will have a brand new look to enjoy for years to come.

CVS Development at Corinth Square

The former Tippins building demolition has been completed and construction of the new CVS building has begun. Construction is anticipated to be completed for an August 2012 opening of the new CVS.

Somerset Road Improvements

The City of Prairie Village is preparing for a street rehabilitation project along Somerset Drive from Roe Ave. to Nall Ave. The project is an extension of the road work completed last summer along Somerset Drive (East of Roe Ave.) and will include new asphalt paving, curb repairs, and sidewalk repairs. The draft project plans also include



two modifications to the existing Somerset Drive corridor: 1) realignment of Somerset Drive at the Nall Ave. intersection and 2) the construction of a widened concrete sidewalk (trail) to replace the existing sidewalk on the East side of Somerset Drive. This project is jointly funded by the County Assistance Road System (CARS) Program. Construction is expected to begin in the summer and be completed by Fall 2012.

Master Trail Plan Amendment

The Master Trail Plan is a comprehensive planning document which is used in determining possible locations for trail segments within the City. The Master Trail Plan was developed, with public input in 2009, as a result of a resident survey which indicated a strong desire for a trail system within Prairie Village. Currently, the Master Trail Map indicates a future trail along Roe Avenue from 63rd Street to Franklin Park. The proposed amendment would change the location of the future Roe Avenue trail segment to Nall Avenue along with extending several east / west connections. At the April 3rd Planning Commission meeting, the Planning Commission recommended not to move forward with the proposed change. This would leave the trail along Roe Avenue. City Council will consider this item at the May 7th City Council meeting at 7:30 pm at City Hall.

Summer Safety Tips

Summer is almost upon us, and with it brings new safety challenges for you and your family. Nicer weather brings with it an increase in activity and pedestrian traffic. Children will be playing outside on their bikes and in the yard. You may be outside mowing the lawn, weeding the garden, or painting the house. Following are some tips to keep in mind this spring and summer to help keep you and your family safe.

- Slow down and watch for children who may suddenly run into the street chasing after their toys.
- Remember to close your garage doors when not in use or when working outside. An open garage is an invitation to a burglar.
- If you must leave your garage door open, lock the interior door to your house.
- Remember to close windows when you are not home. You may let in more than just a breeze. Burglars can, and will, enter houses through open windows.
- Lock exterior doors when you leave, no matter how long you will be gone. Burglars can be in and out of your home in minutes if the door is left unlocked.
- Stop your newspaper, mail and other deliveries when going on vacation.
- Do not post on social media sites that you are on vacation. Post after you return so only trusted people know your house is empty. Sign up for a House Watch on our website at www.pvkansas.com.

- Let a trusted neighbor know you are leaving and ask them to keep an eye on your home.
- Always be aware of your surroundings and call 911 if you see any suspicious activity in your neighborhood. You are our first line of defense.

Debugging Your Roses

If you're worried about bugs on your roses, then the May meeting of the Johnson County Rose Society (JCRS) will be one you won't want to miss.
