Dale Cole was born and raised in Kansas, served as an optometrist in the Army for 2 years and practiced for 35 years here in Salina, Kansasretiring in May '06.

In the mid-1980's, Dr. Cole began taking photos during travels on missions with VOSH/International--an organization that does volunteer eye care work around the world. He would use the photos in slide presentations to local organizations. Over the years, photography 'developed' into a major part of his life.
