CITY COUNCIL CITY OF PRAIRIE VILLAGE December 17, 2007

The City Council of Prairie Village, Kansas, met in regular session on Monday, December 17, 2007, at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Ron Shaffer called the meeting to order and roll call was taken with the following Council members present: Al Herrera, Ruth Hopkins, David Voysey, Michael Kelly, Andrew Wang, Laura Wassmer, Pat Daniels, Charles Clark, and David Belz.

Also present were: Quinn Bennion, City Administrator; Katie Logan, representing the City Attorney; Wes Jordan, Chief of Police and Joyce Hagen Mundy, City Clerk.

Mayor Shaffer led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATION

Bob Pryzby read from a police report dated December 12th at 3:56 a.m. that acknowledged a call to dispatch at 1:30 a.m. from a public works crew consisting of Cail Hendry and Chris Worden reporting an elderly woman out walking. The crew stayed with the woman until police arrived. The police were able to contact the 83-year old woman's daughter and return her home.

Mr. Pryzby called Mr. Hendry and Mr. Worden forward and presented them with a proclamation thanking them for their caring actions in helping one of our citizens

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Carole Plesser, 7938 Canterbury, addressed the Council and requested her comments be included verbatim in the minutes. They are as follows:

"As long time residents of Prairie Village, we concern ourselves with the decisions that affect our fair city. We realize changes must be made that monies need to be spent, and taxes may even need to be raised. We do, however, take issue with many of the decisions made by this city council.

Obviously, it is good to reach out and promote good feelings amongst people and nations. However, spending our tax dollars to send Councilman Michael Kelly to Dolyna, Ukraine, as a representative of goodwill, is an insult to the residents of our city.

On 3/19/07, Councilman Kelly seconded the motion to squelch my right to continue speaking during the open forum portion of the city council meeting. In attendance (there to observe and earn their merit badges) were boy scouts from troops #84, 91 and 283.

In view of the additional taxes that residents of Prairie Village are expected to pay, we concern ourselves with unnecessary waste. We need to ensure that the funds our city government allocates will directly benefit and improve the quality of life in Prairie Village.

Councilman Kelly is hardly the person who should be sent on a holiday; as a representative to demonstrate our values of freedom.

Councilman Vennard's resignation is a welcome step towards restoring democracy for residents in Prairie Village. Hopefully, the Mayor will fill the vacancy with someone who respects citizen rights, and no longer will residents have to be concerned with having their right to speak challenged by the dictatorial behavior of council members, as mine were on 3/19/07, during the public forum portion of the City Council meeting."

Stanley Plesser, 7938 Canterbury, acknowledged the need for additional tax dollars; however, expressed concern with the unwise expenditure of funds by the City Council. He particularly referenced the expenditure of more than \$200,000 for the installation of brick pavers in major City intersections along Mission Road and subsequent expenditure of \$70,000 to replace bricks caused by faulty installation. Mr. Plesser stated he had requested copies of invoices and information from public works and was advised he would be charged for copies and research. He would like to know how many bricks were purchased, how many were used, etc. He feels this information should be made available to residents at no cost. He questioned why the City was paying for replacement caused by a contractor error. Mr. Plesser is concerned that city money is not being spent wisely.

Mr. Plesser stated several months ago he requested from Public Safety a warning sign to be placed at the corner of 79th & Falmouth. He was directed to Public Works, who in turn directed him back to Public Safety. He questioned who he needs to write to get action.

Mr. Plesser also expressed concern with Mr. Herrera's comments at a recent meeting regarding citizen input on 75th Street Corridor improvements that he felt it was the responsibility of the Council to determine what action is to take place even if there was resident opposition. Mr. Plesser does not feel it is appropriate for a Council representative to say the Council does not need the support of the people. It is important for Council representatives to always have the best interest of its citizens. Mr. Plesser stated he felt recent actions indicate the need for a "citizen oversight group" to ensure the wise expenditure of funds. In summary, Mr. Plesser stated he wants to know how to get information on the bricks and sign he discussed and who to contact to get them at no cost.

Mayor Shaffer acknowledged the Plesser's comments and stated they would get the requested information, but noted it is the City's policy to require reimbursement for copy and research costs.

STAFF REPORTS

Public Safety - Chief Wes Jordan

 Chief Jordan advised the Council of a new unfunded mandate from the state requiring the submittal of "palm prints" in addition to fingerprints for certain crimes. Chief Jordan noted the city does not have the equipment to do this and to date has not submitted the information. They are investigating ways to meet this new state mandate.

Ruth Hopkins asked what the cost of a digital printer. Chief Jordan responded \$20,000 to \$30,000. Mrs. Hopkins asked if grant funds would be available. Staff is exploring that possibility.

• The City's Communicator System is obsolete and the department is exploring replacement options. Chief Jordan introduced Tim Kobe, Communications Specialist with the Department to report on one option.

Tim Kobe stated he had met with representatives of "Code Red Notification Systems" a web based system that owns its own infrastructure and would be responsible for maintenance and upgrades. The company provides service to over 750 cities/counties. The system is exceptionally fast and would be able to get information to all of Prairie Village and Mission Hills within 10 to15 minutes. The system has text messaging and paging capability. The cost would be \$10,000 based on a population base of 25,000.

Chief Jordan stated the City currently spends \$3000 for updating the existing Communicator. The proposed system has a significantly larger data base. He added a future option available with this system would allow users to sign up for notification which would allow notification to cell phones. There is also a option called "Thundercall" that provides direct messages on weather warnings.

Mayor Shaffer confirmed this is the first company researched by the department and others will follow. Quinn Bennion added it is the intent of staff to share the costs with the City of Mission Hills and to attempt to get a new system at the approximate cost for running the current system.

Public Works - Bob Pryzby

- Bob Pryzby reported the four storms over the past two weeks resulted in five to six inches of snow.
- 924 tons of salt were used with most of the use occurring last weekend.
- 1326 labor hours were spent with crews working 12 hour shifts, 974 hours were spent last weekend

 Mr. Pryzby read a proclamation he received on behalf of the City from the City of Greensburg, Kansas for the city's support in their recovery efforts by donating equipment which would have normally been auctioned.

Administration - Quinn Bennion

Council Committee of the Whole

COU2007-77 Consider Fund Transfer from 2007 to 2008

On behalf of the Council Committee of the Whole, Andrew Wang moved the City Council authorize the transfer of \$14,150 from Public Safety Account 01-03-25-7100 to the City's general fund with the understanding that equivalent funds will be approved in 2008 from the contingency fund for their intended purchase of in-car laptop computers. The motion was seconded by Ruth Hopkins and passed unanimously.

COU2007-76 Consider approval of Network Services Agreement with Alexander Open Services for 2008 and 2009

On behalf of the Council Committee of the Whole, Andrew Wang moved the City Council approve a Network Services Agreement with Alexander Open Systems subject to review and approval by the City Attorney. The motion was seconded by Ruth Hopkins and passed unanimously.

Finance Committee

David Voysey reported the Finance Committee met to consider new revenue sources, particularly those which could have an impact in 2008. The committee will be bringing forth in January information on a possible "storm water utility fee". This fee is based on the amount of impervious surface flowing from properties and includes all properties within the City. Mr. Voysey noted stormwater improvements are one of the largest budgetary items for the City.

Charles Clark added a 2009 sales tax increase may also be possible. He noted Johnson County has placed on the August ballot approval of a sales tax increase replacing the school sales tax with 36% of the tax coming back to cities. If approved this would create an estimated additional \$500,000.

OLD BUSINESS

Quinn Bennion stated he would like to see the carryover of budgeted funds from one year into the next discouraged in the future. The budgeted funds were approved for a reason and if they were not needed, they should be returned to the City budget as they are city funds.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no New Business to come before the Council.
