# CITY COUNCIL CITY OF PRAIRIE VILLAGE November 5, 2007

The City Council of Prairie Village, Kansas, met in regular session on Monday, November 5, 2007, at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building.

# **ROLL CALL**

Mayor Ron Shaffer called the meeting to order and roll call was taken with the following Council members present: Al Herrera, Ruth Hopkins, David Voysey, Michael Kelly, Andrew Wang, Laura Wassmer, Pat Daniels, Charles Clark, Wayne Vennard, Diana Ewy Sharp and David Belz.

Also present were: Quinn Bennion, City Administrator; Charles Wetzler, City Attorney; Wes Jordan, Chief of Police; Tom Trienens, Manager of Engineering Services; Doug Luther, Assistant City Administrator and Joyce Hagen Mundy, City Clerk.

Mayor Shaffer led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Jeff Anthony, 8531 Cedar, addressed the City Council with his comments in support of the proposed redevelopment of the Meadowbrook Golf Club property noting the city's need to provide a new stock of affordable homes for empty-nesters so they can remain a critical asset to this community. He stated the Council must think outside the box to protect the long-term viability of the City, that they have an obligation to do what is best for the City as a whole.

### OATH OF OFFICE

Quinn Bennion was sworn in as the City's City Administrator and welcomed by the Mayor and Council. Mr. Bennion introduced his wife and thanked Barbara Vernon for her assistance in the transition. He stated he is pleased to be working for the City and looks forward to working with the existing city staff and the city council.

### **PRESENTATIONS**

Mayor Ron Shaffer read the Resolution created honoring the accomplishments and service of former City Administrator Barbara Vernon. He also presented Mrs. Vernon with an autographed book on the works of Tom Corbin, the artist who created the sculpture that will be placed at City Hall in honor of Barbara's contributions to the City of Prairie Village.

# STAFF REPORTS

# Public Safety - Chief Wes Jordan

- The Reverse 911 Communicator purchased in conjunction with Mission Hills six and a half years ago at a cost of \$30,000 is broken. The Department has been told by the manufacturer that the system is obsolete and that they will no longer provide support or repair. Chief Jordan noted there are several similar systems currently on the market. He has spoken with the City Administrator of Mission Hills who advised him that 60% of their residents would require a system that would provide telephone notification. Chief Jordan asked if the Council felt the system was necessary.
- It was the consensus of the Council that the expectation of the residents is that the
  system is available and they felt it should be available; however, they stressed that it
  only be used in true emergency situations. Chief Jordan stated he does not support
  the purchase of stand alone systems and would be doing more research into the best
  solution for this problem.
- Chief Jordan provided an update on the missing 14 year-old Prairie Village student.
   The School Resource Officer has been working closely on the case. The department

has no leads, the girl left on her own and there is no reason to suspect she is in eminent danger.

### **Public Works - Tom Trienens**

Bob Pryzby is home from the hospital recovering from his surgery and doing well.

### Community Programs - Doug Luther

- One-fourth of the cities residences are now covered under the homes association notification program, where the homes associations will be notified of any building permits for any building project that involves the partial or total demolition of a home, increases the interior square footage or alters the building footprint of the structure.
- On October 27<sup>th</sup>, the City Codes Department participated in the Home Renovation Workshop with the City of Mission. The event was very well attended with several Prairie Village residents getting information at the city's booth.
- Mr. Luther explained a new feature on the website allowing Council members to sign up to receive Council updates, the PV Voice, etc. delivered to their mailbox.

### Administration - Quinn Bennion

- Introduced Karen Kindle to present the Third Quarter Financial Report
  - The City received the final tax levy figure from the county with the City's levy being 18.166 mills
  - The City's Fund Balance as of 9/30/2007 is \$7.4 million with an unreserved fund balance of \$2,477,030.
  - Revenue continues to be flat; Expenditures are on target with 75.44% of the budget utilized by 9/30/2007.
  - Only 21.9% of the contingency reserve has been used to date.
  - The Johnson County School Sales Tax Reserve balance is \$1,807,545.29.
  - The Risk Management Reserve Fund balance is \$85,349.32.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

### Council Committee of the Whole

COU2007-67 Consider HNTB Engineering Change Order #4 for SME Parking Lot

Andrew Wang reported the City has agreed to participate with the Shawnee Mission School District to create additional parking spaces at Shawnee Mission East High School. The project would be added to the 2008 Street Resurfacing Program with the design work being done in 2007.

On behalf of the Council Committee of the Whole, Andrew Wang moved the City Council approve Engineering Change Order #4 with HNTB for Project 190864: 2008 Street

Resurfacing Program in the amount of \$22,550.00 bringing the new contract amount to \$258,275.00. The motion was seconded by Ruth Hopkins and passed by a vote of 8 to 3 with Voysey, Wang and Vennard voting "nay".

# **Finance Committee**

### Financial Advisor

David Voysey reported the committee interviewed three firms to provide financial advisory services on October 10<sup>th</sup>. Company references were then checked by staff and on October 15<sup>th</sup> the committee unanimously agreed to accept the proposal of Springsted.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, David Voysey moved the City Council approve an agreement with Springsted to serve as the City's financial advisor. The motion was seconded by Wayne Vennard and passed unanimously.

### **Economic Development Fund**

On October 15<sup>th</sup>, the City Council approved the establishment of an Economic Development Fund. Some of the designated funds were used for the Council retreat/worksession held in July.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, David Voysey moved the City Council authorize the transfer of \$1,492,000 from the General Fund to the Economic Development Fund. The motion was seconded by Charles Clark and passed unanimously.

### **Community Center Committee**

David Belz reported the committee has not heard back from the YMCA regarding a joint partnership for programming. During the committee's research of programs and facilities available in the area, it was found that there are several locations available in Prairie

Village for meetings. Mr. Belz reviewed a brochure created listing available meeting sites and contact names and numbers.

Ruth Hopkins asked if this information was available on the City's website. Doug Luther responded it was not at this time. It is currently being used by City staff to assist individuals needing meeting accommodations that can not be met by the City. The committee did not want to initially flood the other locations with calls, but wanted to have other options available if the City could not accommodate residents' meeting needs.

Ruth Hopkins asked if the committee is looking into the possibility of sharing resources with the Cities of Mission and Overland Park. Mr. Belz stated this is being explored.

### **Homes Association Committee**

Michael Kelly advised that the first Homes Association Committee meeting would be held on Tuesday, November 20<sup>th</sup>.

# **Environment/Recycle Committee**

Ruth Hopkins reported that she and Mayor Shaffer attended the November 2<sup>nd</sup> Mayor's Sustainability Conference at Rockhurst College. The event was very well attended and featured several informative panel presentations. During the event, 14 area mayors were present to sign the "Climate Protection Resolution". Mayor Shaffer added that some mayors were unable to attend, but the resolution was actually being signed by 20 to 25 area mayors on behalf of their cities.

### OLD BUSINESS

Doug Luther noted the Prairie Village promotional items of a notepad and luggage tag that are now available. He stated these were handed out at the recent Home Renovation seminar.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Pat Daniels asked for an update on the completion of the Tomahawk Bridge. Tom Trienens responded it was structurally complete, but full completion of the project would be in 2008. Chris Engel stated he been told the bridge would be open for traffic before the Holidays.
