## MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Greetings Prairie Village Residents:

On behalf of the City Council and city staff, I would like to thank the residents who came out to support the 19th annual VillageFest event, as well as the VillageFest Committee for their tireless efforts to plan yet another terrific 4th of July festival. From the pancake breakfast to the live entertainment, the spirit of celebration was alive and well in Prairie Village! The festive atmosphere will

continue with the coming Jazz Festival on September 12 at Harmon Park. Check out all the details on pages 5-8. I hope to see you there!

I'm pleased to announce that the City Council adopted the 2016 Budget at the August 3, 2015 City Council meeting. The 2016 budget maintains the current mill levy rate of 19.493 which equates to a monthly rate of \$44.00 for City services for the average homeowner. The 2016 budget objectives included maintaining high quality services and programs, maintaining quality streets, parks and infrastructure, continuing a strong financial position with a AAA bond rating, and increasing financial transparency.

At the August 17, 2015 City Council meeting, Council approved a revised plan with a reduced size and scope for the Mission Chateau senior living facility and townhomes at the former Mission Valley site. The approved plan was agreed upon by the Tutera Group and the Mission Valley neighbors.

VanTrust Real Estate, LLC, Johnson County Government, the City of Prairie Village, and Johnson County Park & Recreation District continue to work together on the redevelopment of the former Meadowbrook Country Club. The City Council voted to set a public hearing on the creation of a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) district for September 8, 2015 at 7:30 p.m. Unlike other TIF districts where the funds are used within a private development, the TIF funds generated by this project will be used to purchase and develop a regional County park and other public infrastructure. The Council will review and discuss many actions related to the Meadowbrook project through the end of 2015.

The projects above are just a few of the items being worked on by City Council and staff. I invite you to peruse the pages of the newsletter, visit our website, and of course, attend our City Council meetings to stay up to date on the latest happenings within Prairie Village.

## **Popular Annual Financial Report**

The City of Prairie Village is pleased to announce its third Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) for the 2014 Fiscal Year. The City produces a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) each year, which outlines the City's financial position and operating activities and includes audited financial statements; however, due to its length and scope, the CAFR is not a user-friendly document.

In an effort to make financial information more accessible, the Finance Department developed the PAFR which includes a summary of City services, Statement of Net Position, revenues, expenditures, debt and an economic outlook. ## CFD2 Earns a Class 1 ISO Rating

CFD2 Consolidated Fire District #2 (CFD2), serving NE Johnson County Kansas, has received a Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating of 1 by ISO (Insurance Services Office). CFD2 improved its ISO rating from a previous rating of 3. CFD2 is one of only ninety-seven fire organizations in the country with a Class 1 ISO rating.



ISO evaluates the fire suppression capabilities of fire organizations across the country according to a uniform set of criteria in areas such as: emergency communications, equipment, staffing, training, station location, operations, community risk reduction and water supply. Information gathered is used to assign PPC ratings. These ratings are utilized by many insurance companies in establishing insurance premiums for homes and businesses. CFD2's achievement of a Class 1 rating may provide an opportunity for residents and business owners within the Fire District to see savings on their insurance premiums. Home and business owners served by CFD2 may want to contact their insurance agents for further information

## Prairie Village Puppy-Pool-Ooza

Area dogs have a chance to get the last splash before the Prairie Village pool is drained for the season. From 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 8, dog owners are invited to bring their pooches for an end of the season swim.

Puppy-Pool-Ooza costs \$5 per dog. Dog owners must provide proof of current vaccinations (no exceptions). Vaccination records can be obtained from your veterinarian. All dogs must remain leashed unless in the water. Dogs weighing less than 25 pounds will be located in the baby pool and dogs weighing more than 25 pounds will be in the zero-entry/leisure pool. Humans will not be allowed to enter the pool during this event.





## **Prescription Drug Take Back Event**

The Prairie Village Police Department will participate in the DEA's 10th National Prescription Drug Take-Back on September 26th from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. A take back site will be located in the circle drive at the Municipal Complex (7710 Mission Road) so local residents can return their unwanted, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs for safe disposal. Needles and syringes cannot be accepted.

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Many Americans are not aware that medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are at alarming rates, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that many abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away – both potential safety and health hazards.


