Legislative/Finance Committee

COU2005-01 Consider 2005 Legislative Program

The Legislative/Finance Committee considered the proposed 2005 Legislative Program, which addressed the following issues: Municipal Revenue, Unfunded Mandates, Spending Limitations and Tax Lids, Franchises and Franchise Fees, and State Funding of Public Education. The committee felt the program should also address the Kansas Open Records Act and Kansas Open Meetings Act and Extension of Eminent Domain.

On behalf of the Legislative/Finance Committee, Bill Griffith moved the City Council approve the 2005 Legislative Program including the following issues: Municipal Revenue, Unfunded Mandates, Spending Limitations and Tax Lids, Franchises and Franchise Fees; State Funding of Public Education; the Kansas Open Records Act and Kansas Open Meetings Act and Extension of Eminent Domain. The motion was seconded by Ruth Hopkins and passed unanimously.

LEG2005-05 Consider 2005 Sports Camp Fees

For the past several years sports organizations have reserved City park facilities to conduct sports camps for children. The committee considered the requests for 2005 sports camps under the same conditions and fees as set in the 2004 agreements.

On behalf of the Legislative/Finance Committee, Bill Griffith moved the City Council approve the 2005 sports camp contracts as written with a per participant fee of \$10 for Challenger, British Soccer and the Kansas City Comets and a per participant fee of \$12 for Omega Soccer. The motion was seconded by Ruth Hopkins and passed unanimously.

POL2005-02- Consider Project 190616: Harmon Park Skate Facility

Steve Noll stated that earlier the City Council had approved the agreement with Grindline, Inc. for the design of the Skate Park facility. The committee considered the agreement for construction of the Skate Park as agreed upon as part of the design/build approval.

On behalf of the Policy/Services Committee, Steve Noll moved the City Council approve the construction contract with Grindline, Inc. in the amount of \$220,275.00 using funds in the Capital Infrastructure Program Project 190616: Harmon Park Skate Facility. The motion was seconded by Kay Wolf and passed unanimously.
