COUNCIL CITY OF PRAIRIE VILLAGE November 5, 2001 -Minutes-

The City Council of Prairie Village, Kansas, met in regular session on Monday, November 5, 2001, at 7:30 p.m. in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Ron Shaffer called the meeting to order with the following Council members responding to roll call: Al Herrera, Ruth Hopkins, Bob Pierson, Roy True, Laura Wassmer, Jerry Kelso, Nancy Vennard, Kay Wolf and Patty Markley.

Also present were: Barbara Vernon, City Administrator; Charles Wetzler, City Attorney; Charles Grover, Chief of Police; Robert Pryzby, Director of Public Works; Doug Luther, Assistant City Administrator and Joyce Hagen Mundy, City Clerk.

PRESENTATION

Chief Grover stated there are three levels of recognition for police officers. The first is citizen recognition such as letters. The second is supervisor recognition and the third is department recognition. Chief Grover recognized Police Officer James Carney for exemplary service in his response to a robbery-in-progress call received on June 8, 2001. Officer Carney was presented with a plaque from the City for exemplary service. Officer Carney will also be receiving the Bronze Award of Valor from the Metropolitan Chiefs and Sheriffs Association. Mayor Shaffer extended the Council's and City's congratulations and appreciation to Officer Carney for his dedication and service.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Council Committee of the Whole

COU2001-23 Consider amendments to Zoning regulations

The Planning Commission has recommended zoning ordinance revisions to address the expansion of single family dwellings. The primary concerns expressed by neighbors of developed single family lots is that the new or expanded dwellings are too large for existing lots; or are out of scale with the residences in the immediate neighborhood and the design is not compatible with the single-family dwellings in the neighborhood.

The proposed ordinance revision adds a definition of lot coverage as "that portion of a lot which is covered by a structure or structures, excluding the first four (4) feet of projecting roof eaves". The ordinance also adds the following restriction to all residential zoning districts: "Lot Coverage. Buildings and structures shall not cover more than 25% of the gross lot area."

Another concern addressed by the proposed ordinance is the grade of new dwellings or renovations of existing structures. Grades significantly higher than those of

adjacent properties can create a negative visual appearance to adjacent neighbors as well as possible stormwater runoff problems. To address this issue, the Commission is proposing the adoption of the building code's definition of grade and specific restrictions to first floor elevations of structures.

Nancy Vennard moved the Council adopt Ordinance 2019 amending Chapter 19.02 of the Prairie Village Municipal Code entitled "Definitions" by adding Section 19.02.306 – Lot Coverage and amending Chapters 19.06, 19.08, 19.10, 19.12 and 19.14 "Residential Zoning Districts" by adding the following Sections: Section 19.96.042; 19.08.036; 19.10.046; 19.12.036 and 19.14.041 to read as follows: "Lot Coverage. Buildings and Structures shall not cover more than 25% of the gross lot area." And further amending Chapter 19.02 of the Prairie Village Municipal Code entitled "Definitions" by adding Section 19.02.234 Grade and amending Chapter 19.44 entitled "Height and Area Exceptions" by adding a new Section 19.44.030 Building Elevations. The motion was seconded by Kay Wolf.

A roll call vote was taken with the following members voting "aye": Herrera, Hopkins, Pierson, True, Wassmer, Kelso, Vennard, Wolf and Markley.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Shaffer asked Bob Pryzby to report on recent right-of-way developments. Mr. Pryzby advised the Council that over the past year, the City has been meeting with Johnson County Wastewater on a Right-of-Way Agreement originally introduced in May of 2000. Last week representatives met again and have resolved the conflicting issues with Section 9 of the proposed agreement. A revised agreement will be presented to the Council for approval. Mayor Shaffer noted that Mr. Pryzby and City Attorney Charles Wetzler have been working to reach right-of-way agreements with county agencies and utility companies for the past three years.

NEW BUSINESS

Bob Pryzby advised the Council of recent changes in the regulation of highway rock salt. The Environmental Protection Agency is no longer allowing highway salt to be stored outdoors. This results in companies only being able to sell what can be

produced/mined on site. The City has received word from Cargill that they would not be able to supply the City with highway salt for the coming year.

Mr. Pryzby reported that the City's salt barn is full and unless there is an unusual winter, the City should have sufficient salt to treat streets. However, he noted that, particularly early in the season, crews have been directed to use salt judiciously. He advised Council members that the level of treatment given to City streets would be less than that received last year. Salt bids will be taken in April for salt for next season to meet the production schedules of salt companies.
