

The Prairie Village Foundation continues to do wonderful work in our community to assist those in need. Thanks to the generous donations of Prairie Village residents and businesses, the Foundation donated more than \$15,000 to help our Prairie Village friends and neighbors in need, as well as donating deeper into the heart of our Johnson County community.

New this year, the Foundation allocated funds directly to the Prairie Village Police Department for their "Citizens Assistance Program." This fund will be used when officers see an immediate need to help a community member. They may see a need arise after a violent wreck or when they respond to a house call. Also new this year, the Foundation allocated funding to Consolidated Fire District #2. Thanks to the Foundation's donation, the Fire District was able to purchase carbon monoxide detectors for county residents who don't already have one installed in their home.

Other organizations receiving funding include: Johnson County Minor Home Repair Fund, Village Food and Clothing Pantry, Lutheran Church of the Resurrection's "Saturday's Miracle" and Habitat for Humanity's "Brush with Kindness" Program. The Prairie Village Foundation takes great pride in providing for our community members - right here in Prairie Village as well as in the Johnson County area. Important Reminders on Dog Safety

Whether a dog is known or unknown there are plenty of tips to stay safe around dogs. Even a dog known as 'friendly' can bite; be cautious to respect their comfort level. It is important to remember that sudden movements and an excited attitude will excite a dog, which could lead to an unsafe situation. Be mindful that reaching or hovering above a dog could make the dog feel attacked or unsafe. Don't lean over a dog or pet the top of their head, a safer option is to pet under the neck or chin. The best way to approach a dog is to allow the dog to approach you while you remain calm and still, allowing them to sniff. The best way to approach a dog with no owner around is: don't!

As a dog owner, it is your responsibility to maintain a safe environment for other people and your dog. Part of being a responsible dog owner is discerning ways to stay safe and keep others safe. Here are some tips:

- Always walk your dog on a leash
- Give other people and dogs space
- ASK before introducing your dog to any person or animal
- Pay attention- to your dog, the environment, and others
- Take precautions to ensure your dog doesn't run loose
- Stay calm and enjoy your time with your pet!
- Dog waste transmits disease, please clean up after your pet.

Summer Road Construction

Simple Steps to Fight the Bite

The most important thing Prairie Village residents can do to prevent the spread of mosquito-borne illnesses such as Zika, Chikungunya and West Nile virus infection is to mosquito-proof your home and wear insect repellant, according to the Johnson County Department of Health and Environment.

Zika is of greatest health concern for pregnant women and those who may become pregnant while infected because the infection is linked to severe birth defects in babies. West Nile virus infection is typically mild, but can cause serious neurological effects, especially in senior adults and children under age 5. Chikungunya infection typically causes joint pain and fever in travelers returning from affected areas. Infants and adults over age 65 are most at risk for severe Chikungunya disease.

The following actions will protect you and your family:



Wear EPA-registered insect repellents, long sleeves and pants to prevent mosquito bites. When used as directed, these insect repellents are proven safe and effective even for pregnant and breastfeeding women. During the day, apply sunscreen first and then the repellent to exposed skin.



Mosquito-proof your home by installing or repairing screens on windows and doors. Use your air conditioning, if you have it. Empty and scrub out items that hold standing water in and around your home. Flower pots, buckets, gutters/downspouts, kiddie pools, grill covers, pet dishes, discarded tires and birdbaths can become a breeding ground for mosquitoes if they are not emptied and cleaned on a regular basis. Tightly cover water storage containers so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.



Pregnant women should avoid travel to any area with Zika.
