MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Greetings Prairie Village Residents—

Spring has arrived in Prairie Village, and with it begins our annual budget process! The City welcomes public input and suggestions related to the 2019 budget. The City Council approaches the budget each year with the goal of providing a high quality of life to our residents through superior services, a safe

community, and well-maintained infrastructure while being mindful of the tax burden. As always, a balanced budget will be established. Please check our website and future editions of the newsletter for more budget information

As I'm sure you are now aware, we have seen substantial increases in our appraised home values in Prairie Village over the past few years. While these increases help us keep pace with the cost of repairing our aging infrastructure, updating our parks, and providing the high quality of life and services we have all come to expect, we are sensitive to the fact that higher assessed values present a challenge to our fixed income residents. If you disagree with your valuation, please visit visit www.jocogov.org/appraiser to learn more about the appeal process.

As the City warms up, we start to see a flurry of activity in our parks, sidewalks, and trails. By the time this newsletter hits your mailboxes, a public meeting will have been held to kick off the planning process for the new North Park at 67th and Roe. Construction fencing has been set, and demolition of the building will occur in early April. Windsor Park will also be under construction this spring as a new shelter is built, new swings are installed, and the walking path is reconfigured. Later this year, permanent restrooms will be installed at Porter Park and the playground equipment at Franklin Park will be upgraded. After significant public input, the city-wide bicycle and pedestrian plan will be presented to the City Council later this spring. Highlights of the plan include sidewalk improvements, trails, and a separated bicycle lane on Nall Avenue.

Last but certainly not least, I urge all residents who receive the citizen satisfaction survey this spring to take a few moments to provide the City your feedback. Your invaluable opinions will help the City Council shape decisions and policies for years to come. Those who don't receive the mailed survey are encouraged to complete it online. It will be linked on our website www.pvkansas.com in the coming weeks.

Citizen Satisfaction Survey

The City of Prairie Village is conducting a citizen satisfaction survey with the ETC Institute this spring. The citizen satisfaction survey will provide residents an opportunity to assess the quality of city services and identify areas for improvement, as well as contribute opinions on priorities and public policy. Resident opinions and feedback are instrumental to the City Council as they set goals, make budgetary decisions, and guide Prairie Village into the future. It is the mission and desire of the City Council to use this tool to shape decisions and policies to continue to provide a high quality of life for all Prairie Village residents.

The ETC Institute is a national leader in market research for local governmental organizations based out of Olathe, Kansas, and has conducted city and county surveys for more than 30 years, including a survey for the City of Prairie Village in 2001. The survey will be administered by mail to a random sampling of 3,000 households throughout Prairie Village and will be available online for all citizens of Prairie Village.

Construction Season in Prairie Village: Enforcement of the Noise Ordinance

It's officially construction season, and there is undoubtedly a lot of new construction happening in Prairie Village. While new construction can be a great thing for the community, it can

also be a very frustrating process. That is why the City has regulations in place to require construction workers and developers to be good neighbors and adhere to the City's noise ordinance.

Loud noise is prohibited before 7:00 a.m. and after 10:00 p.m. on weekdays, and before 8:00 a.m. and after midnight on weekends. This includes construction noise in neighborhoods.

If you live near new construction and witness this ordinance being violated, you can call the Police Department at 913-642-5151 to report the issue. The Police Department can only enforce this ordinance when they witness it being violated, so do not hesitate to reach out to us to report a violation when it is occurring.

It's important to the City that new construction occurs with minimal disturbance to our residents, and this is one of the ways you can help us ensure we are encouraging responsible construction in our community.

2018 Large Item Pick Up

It's time to get rid of unwanted junk from your garage or basement during the City's annual Large Item Pick-up.

• Saturday, April 14, 2018 for residents on both sides of 75th Street and north of 75th Street

• Saturday, April 21, 2018 for residents south of 75th Street

Items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m.

Items collected include:

- Appliances
- Railroad ties (4' or less in length)
- Fencing (Cut into 3' x 4' sections. Bundle loose pickets for easy collection.)
- Furniture
- Tree limbs cut to 4' or less in length and secured in bundles not more than 18" in diameter.
- Carpet (cut into 4' x 4' sections)
- Items not collected by regular trash service.



Items should be no larger than a standard-size refrigerator. Republic will pick up refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and ice makers, however, the refrigerant must be removed. Loose items should be bundled. For complete large item pick-up rules visit www.pvkansas.com/largeitempickup. If you have additional questions, call Republic Services at 913-281-4343. All household members over 18 will be required to show identification and/or a utility or credit card bill to verify proof of residency. Children under one year of age do not require an ID card and will be admitted free to the pool.

Pool memberships are non-refundable/non-transferable. Daily Admission fees and 5-Swim cards will not be refunded or applied to a membership purchase.

5-Swim cards are only valid for the season in which they are purchased.

ID CARDS

All new pool members are required to obtain a photo ID in the City Clerk's office. Existing members can use their previous card or obtain a new one. ID cards must be presented upon entering the pool complex only by the person to whom the ID card is issued. Any violations or "pass backs" of ID cards may result in forfeiture of your membership privileges for the remainder of the season.

SUPERPASS POOLS

With the SuperPass, your annual Prairie Village pool membership will allow you unlimited access to all of the partnering pools. In addition to the PV Pool, you will gain admittance to: Fairway, Leawood, Merriam, Mission, and Roeland Park.

POOL RENTALS

Prairie Village residents may rent the Leisure Pool, Slide Pool, and Diving Well as a package any available evening June 1 - July 31. Parties may be held from 8:30 - 10:00 pm, after the pool closes to the public. The rental fee is \$350. All food must be kept within the concessions area and guests will not be permitted in the complex until 8:30 pm. In addition, all pool rules apply during pool rentals. Note: The Pool Manager on duty may close the entire pool complex, or any portions of the pool complex, for any weather, safety or maintenance reason. Parks, Recreation & Community TENNIS IN PRAIRIE VILLAGE

Tracy Cooper, USPTA Certified, will be returning to the Prairie Village Tennis Program this year and assume all coaching responsibilities.

Tennis courts are available in Harmon, McCrum, and Windsor parks to all Prairie Village residents on a first come, first-served basis, freeof-charge, when courts are not reserved for tournaments or City-sponsored lessons.

Future Stars Clinic (Ages 11 to 16) – M, T, TH from 10:00 a.m. – 10:50 a.m. Cost is \$60 per participant. There is a minimum enrollment of 4 and maximum enrollment of 10.

KANSAS CITY JUNIOR TENNIS LEAGUE (KCJTL)

Prairie Village is a member of the Kansas City Junior Tennis League (KCJTL). In this program, youth ages 8 - 18 develop, improve, and refine their tennis skills. The League consists of weekly clinics, Challenge Days, weekly team matches, and an end-of-year tournament. Cost is \$105 per participant (\$100 for each additional family member on team) which includes the registration fee for the end-of-year tournament. No refunds will be allowed for the Kansas City Junior Tennis League team. Interested players must register by May 14 to be eligible for the first week of league play. League play runs from June 4 to July 13. End of the year tournament will be held July 16 to 20.

TENNIS CAMPS

Private & Semi-Private Lessons (Adult or Youth)

Private Lessons allow instructors the opportunity to work with players on individual needs. The fee is \$25 per person for 30 minute lesson.

Semi-Private Lessons for two persons are structured to meet individual needs. The fee is \$16 per person for 30 minute lesson.

Three and a Pro is a program for youth. You bring two friends and play with the pro. The cost is \$18 per player for 60 minutes.



PRAIRIE VILLAGE RECREATION PROGRAM FEE ASSISTANCE

Pavilions in City parks may be reserved throughout the year for use between 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. Pavilions are available in Franklin, Harmon, Taliaferro, Porter, Weltner, Windsor, and Bennett Parks, as well as the Santa Fe Pavilion in Harmon Park. The fee for pavilion reservation is \$8.00 per hour for Prairie Village residents and \$15.00 per hour for non-residents. Large groups may reserve both sections of the Franklin or Harmon Park Pavilions. The fee for these reservations is \$12.00 per hour for Prairie Village residents and \$22.50 per hour for non-residents.

BALL FIELD RESERVATIONS

PVPD Announces Village Video Cooperative

What is the Village Video Cooperative?

The Village Video Cooperative (VVC) is a partnership between the Prairie Village Police Department and participating residents and/or business owners who have video recording devices viewing public areas of their properties and wish to share the video to aid in crime prevention.

How does the program work?

If a criminal incident takes place in the vicinity of your camera, you may be contacted by the Prairie Village Police Department. Police personnel may request you review and/ or provide recorded footage related to the date and time of the incident. When the immediacy of a crime dictates, a Prairie Village Detective may ask to view your footage on-site.

Video obtained by the Prairie Village Police Department from privately held security cameras may be used to investigate, apprehend, and prosecute criminals. Registration is simple and only takes a few minutes to complete.

How do I register my camera(s)?

Protect your family, your business, and our community by registering to be part of the Village Video Cooperative.

On the registration form, you'll be asked to provide contact information, as well as basic information about the location, direction, and recording quality of your cameras. Once you've submitted the registration form, a member of the Prairie Village Police Department will follow up with you for confirmation. There is no fee to register and your information will be kept confidential. You can unsubscribe from the program at any time.

The Prairie Village Police Department will provide small "Village Video Cooperative" window signs for partners who want to place them on home or business windows to help deter criminal activity.

Important Reminders on Dog Safety

- ASK before introducing your dog to any person or animal
- Pay attention- to your dog, the environment, and others
- Take precautions to ensure your dog doesn't run loose
- Stay calm and enjoy your time with your pet!
